From the Rector's desk: Today is the first of five Sundays of Lent, which will take us up to Palm Sunday, and the events of Holy Week, commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the last supper with his disciples (first celebration of the Eucharist), washing of their feet as an humble act of service to others, his betrayal into the hands of his enemies, his arrest, mock trial and crucifixion. The season of Lent is also a time for us to begin preparing ourselves for the great celebration of Easter, through prayer, fasting, repentance, and selfdenial. It's a 40 day commemoration of Jesus' time of prayer and fasting in the desert, being tempted by Satan, so as to prepare for his public ministry. Today's gospel shows Jesus being baptized by his cousin, John the Baptist, and, as he comes up from the water a marvelous thing happens, the heavens open, a dove descends upon him, and God's voice is heard to say -You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased! Then Jesus has his intense wilderness experience to find the courage and strength needed for what lay before him. John the Baptist's work is now complete, he has prepared the way for the One

mightier than he. Jesus' ministry would be just a little more than 3 years before facing the cross, but it would be one that would change and continue to change the world like nothing before or after. One that continues to give us hope because he rose again victorious over evil, sin and death. Easter is our goal, but Lent and Holy Week is the journey we make to get there. I encourage all of us to really make use of these weeks of journeying together, so that we too can find strength and courage, to face and overcome the temptations of life that distract us, whatever they might look like for each one of us. If Jesus needed to spend this time of preparation to confront the world around him, and to effectively proclaim the Gospel message of hope and salvation to those in need, how much more important is it for us to make prayer an essential daily part of our own lives, so that we too are prepared as much as possible to live faithful to God, and living examples to others of what God can do for us when we are in relationship with him. May your Lenten experience be one that draws you ever closer to God and inspire you in your service to him.




