

From the Rector's Desk

This is a joyful and happy day in the life of our Parish. We are happy to have Bishop Geoffrey Peddle with us for the Service of Confirmation this morning. Seventeen young people will affirm their faith in Jesus Christ, renew their commitment to him, and with God's help promise to follow him as Saviour and Lord.

Today, the whole congregation promises to support them in their life in Christ and joins with these seventeen young people in renewing their own baptismal covenant. The Bishop lays his hands upon those being confirmed and asks the Lord to strengthen them in the Holy Spirit, to empower them in God's service in the Church and in the world, and to sustain them in their life.

As members of the Church, it is a good time for all of us, candidates for confirmation included, to step back a bit and to do some sober and prayerful thinking about what all of this implies. It is not a graduation from anything, as it is often treated. Indeed it is a continuation of what began at Baptism. In the words of the BCP, we are strengthened by the Holy Spirit at confirmation ".....to continue as Christ's faithful soldiers and servants unto their life's end."

We have been taught in our Anglican Faith that Baptism represents unto us our profession. Indeed, some have called Baptism a lay person's ordination. It surely implies continuing to learn and grow in the faith, to actively participate in the life and worship of the Church, to be disciples and servants of the Lord. We can never graduate from these things; we can only continue to grow into all of that through grace and an active and lively faith.

I have encouraged and challenged this fine group of young people to fulfill their baptismal ministry by actively pursuing ways of being involved in the life and faith of this church community. This requires commitment, encouragement and support

from parents and godparents in helping them to move forward in this way. Indeed, it will require the love and support and encouragement of the entire faith community, just as we have promised in Baptism and Confirmation. It is my earnest prayer that all of us may be resolved to make Confirmation the great gift it is meant to be and never ever to treat it as a "graduation".

In the future, preparation for Confirmation will be a two-year program. The first year will be mostly about teaching the faith and growth in spirituality. The second year will be about learning to fulfill our Baptismal Covenant through Sunday Worship and by being actively engaged in some aspect of ministry and service in our church family. It will be a requirement that the student and parents commit to this program. It is reasonable to expect this kind of response if Confirmation Preparation is to help the young people to be all that God has called them to be. Without that kind of commitment, no Program for Confirmation is workable. Therefore, I prayerfully appeal to parents and godparents, as well as students for Confirmation, to make an honest and prayerful response in order to make Confirmation the gift the church has meant it to be.

Today, let us be joined in heart and in faith as these young people renew their baptismal covenant and make promises in God's name. As our Bishop lays hands upon each one of them and prays over them, may they be strengthened by the Holy Spirit to fulfill the discipleship and ministry to which God has called them.

I would ask the people to take care to say their "Amen" as the Bishop lays hands on each one and prays over them.
