From the Rector's desk: By this time we have all come through the season of Christmas, hopefully, it was a very joyful season of family celebration for everyone. For some, unfortunately, part of it was a time of grief and sorrow, with the loss of a loved one, either from natural causes or tragic circumstances. I pray that they were able to find some degree of comfort through the prayers and presence of others, and, that the spirit of Christmas was able to give them an abiding sense of hope. I was especially pleased with our Christmas Eve services at St. Philip's parish. Our 4:00 pm service included the Sunday School Christmas pageant, and I want to commend both our children and teachers for the tremendous job they did to relay the true meaning of Christmas to us all. #### THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD 6th JANUARY

(A synopsis of today's readings)

1st Reading: Isaiah 60.1-6: Isaiah contrasts the darkness that covers the nations with the light and glory of the Lord. He describes how this divine light will attract all the nations of the earth to assemble in adoration.
