From the Rector's desk For five weeks we have been journeying through Lent, a time of reflection and awareness of the journey Jesus took in the wilderness, hungry, thirsty and tempted by Satan. He knew that the Cross would be his ultimate destination, but, he also knew that God was working out a divine plan for the salvation of humanity. Today, on this Palm Sunday, we find ourselves reenacting and commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on the back of a meek and mild donkey. Just close your eyes for a moment and imagine all that might have been going on that day, many had gathered from near and far for the Passover feast, it was a bustling city, there was much excitement in the air as they believed they were welcoming a conquering king or messiah, one that would free them from the oppressive rule of the conquering Romans, a time they dreamed of for so long. They shouted Hosanna, threw their clothes on the dusty road for him to ride over, and waved palm branches in the air. That was Sunday, by Thursday they had turned against him, had him arrested, gave him a mock trial and crucified him in a most brutal fashion on

Friday. They had a certain expectation of who Jesus should be, and, when he did not fulfil their expectation of the long awaited messiah, they quickly rejected him. Christians today also have a preconceived notion of the kind of Jesus they want, and, oftentimes many reject the one that challenges them to put love of God, and love of neighbour ahead of their own selfish ambitions and goals. During this Holy Week we have opportunity to draw near unto Jesus and follow the events of his life that took him to the Cross. To truly appreciate Easter we need to experience Good Friday. Next Sunday we will sing the Alleluias of Easter, and, celebrate the very foundation of our faith. But Easter is not a single day, there will be another five weeks of the season before Pentecost. Truly we are an Easter People, and we live every day in the glory of Easter! (Rev. Randy)






