From the Rector's desk: Today, in the church we celebrate Mother's Day, it is one of the busiest days of the whole year, more gifts, cards, chocolate and flowers will be lovingly presented to mothers than we can imagine. We can make a legitimate point that it's another of the special times of year where big business profits, but that might be at the risk of losing sight of the greater point - WE LOVE OUR MOTHERS AND WANT TO SHOW THEM IN SPECIAL WAYS. So we like to make a big deal of it, so that all moms in our church this morning know how much they are loved and appreciated. There seems to be something about Mother's Day that captures the essence of love, and, nurturing like no other day of the year, and us fathers and children go the distance to make sure our wives and mothers know how much we love and cherish them, it really is a big day. The nurturing and love of a mother also gets carried over into the Church, as we often refer to it as Mother Church. In some parts of the Christian church, we observe Mothering Sunday, which arose in the 16<sup>th</sup> century with the practice of one day of the year set aside for families to return to the church from which they came, the church where they were baptised, and, through baptism given birth, or new life into the Church Family. Children would pick wild flowers along the way and place in the church or give it to their mothers, as a sign of love. Often, when we refer to the CHURCH, we say "She" or "Her", the New Testament also makes reference to the Church being the Bride of Christ. No doubt when Jesus was being raised as a child by his earthly parents, Mary and Joseph, he experienced the profound love of them both, but consider how much Mary is there when Jesus is

arrested, placed on trial and crucified on the Cross. You can feel, in a powerful way, the love between mother and son. Mother's Day, like Father's Day, is a day to celebrate the family unit, to be thankful for the blessings God has given to us in the sharing of our lives together. Today we pray for all mothers, and families, as they do so much to ensure their children are raised in loving and nurturing homes. For many of us, our moms are no longer with us, but, the memories of their love are still so vivid and real. Anytime we have occasion to celebrate the family unit we should really do so, for the greatest gift God has given to us is the gift of each other. In the busy world we live in today it's easy to miss the golden opportunities to celebrate our families, and, the love shared. Jesus said that there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friend. Perhaps the greatest example of unconditional love, where indeed one would literally lay down one's life is to be found in the family. I would venture to say that practically every mom would be ready to do that for a child. So if you came to church today with your mom give her the biggest hug you can and tell her all through this special day how much you love her. HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY TO ALL MOMS!!!!!
