From the Rector's desk Today marks the fifth and final Sunday of Lent. Perhaps a time to reflect back over these last 33 days to see how Lent has changed us, or, will change us in the one remaining week. Lent is about a journey Jesus took to prepare himself for what lay before him, which, of course we will commemorate next week when we begin with his triumphal entry into Jerusalem on the back of a meek and lowly donkey. From there we will hear of how he gathered with his disciples in the upper room to celebrate the Last Supper (the first Eucharist), and, to wash their feet as a humble act of service to others. How he was then betrayed by one of his own into the hands of the enemies, arrested, beaten, placed on trial and condemned to death, mocked and spit upon as he carried his own cross to Golgotha, and nailed to it on Good Friday and died a lonely and excruciating death. Jesus' journey for 40 days in the wilderness, alone, hungry, thirsty and being tempted by the Devil, was part of his preparation for the journey to the cross, so that he might endure suffering and death so

as to redeem us. Jesus' journey was one of perfection, he passed every test and overcame every obstacle Satan placed in his path. What about our journey? Have we been conscious these past 5 weeks of the sin and temptation in our own lives? Have we prayed for strength from God to help us? We still have one more week of Lent to strengthen our will and resolve. Our entire lives, in many ways, are wilderness journeys, preparing us, not for a physical cross and death, because Jesus made that journey for us, once and for all, but rather for eternal life in the Kingdom of God. I encourage all of us to live daily holding before us the sacrifice Jesus made on the cross, knowing that he has shown us the way, he has given us the grace and strength to be faithful. That when we do fall he has made it possible for us to be forgiven and start over again. Rev. Randy


