From the Rector's desk: This is one of the most anticipated long weekends of the whole year. Thanksgiving seems to be a time when families want to be together, hence, many people are traveling by land, water and air this weekend. In an age where we have so much "stuff", it's refreshing to see that, when it comes right down to it, the things we are truly thankful for is none of that material "stuff". What we are most thankful for is really the essence of our life and being, such as family, faith, health, the ability to provide for our loved ones, and a sense of being at peace with ourselves, others, the world around us and God . At this time it serves us well to stop and consider where we are in our lives, and, to think about what we have, and what we truly need for happiness and contentment in life. God blesses us with so much, and, a measure of our thanksgiving is what we do with what God gives to us. In a materialistic world where individualism is front and centre, it is often difficult to wrap our heads around the notion that, God blesses us with so much so that we can be agents of blessings to others. In the Anglican Journal that many of you received this past

week, there is a colorful full page there that is titled – *Down On The Farm*. The emphasis is on helping families to feed themselves in some African countries. For example you *buy the whole farm for \$470*, which includes a cow for \$200, a goat for \$30, 2 pigs for \$30, 5 sheep for \$50, 40 chickens for \$40, 20 guinea fowl for \$40, a 20 kg bag of seeds for \$30, and farming tools for \$50. One can also give smaller amounts to sponsor a portion of these farming animals and things. Perhaps a good thing for a family to do this Thanksgiving is to contact PWRDF and consider such a project, simply as a way of showing thanksgiving for our blessings. Of course, there are many ways to do that, but being thankful is necessary, whichever way we do it. That wonderful gospel reading today from Matthew (6:25-33) is a beautiful reminder to us, as God's beloved children, that we are in God's care, and God is going to provide us with the things we need in life to be happy and content. Remember, I said *the things we need*, not necessarily all the things we want, because sometimes we don't need all the things we want. May this Thanksgiving be a time for us all to be truly thankful to God for the things we have that truly matter. (*Rev. Randy*)

Floors have been redone - We had the floors in the kitchen, The Canon E.B. Cheeseman Parish Centre, the foyer, bathrooms, office area (total of 5000 sq. ft.) done on a contract. This work included deep scrubbing /stripping of the floor, detailing of baseboards and edges, and, application of 3 coats of top quality floor finish. These floors were in great need of refinishing, and, as we bring in a considerable amount of money from rentals, it is important for our building to be looking great. We ask groups using the building, especially the foyer, parish centre & kitchen, to use great care when moving around tables and chairs.
