From the Rector's desk: Recently there was a lot of hype in the financial world when the giant technological company, "Apple", reached a pinnacle that no other company had ever achieved. The company became the first to ever be valued at more than \$1,000,000,000,000 If that looks like a lot of zeros it really is, its one trillion dollars. Thats an astronomical number to wrap our heads around, but in a household of 5 with all kinds of Apple products that cost a tremendous amount I can see why they are so wealthy. In an age where so much value is placed on material wealth, and the ability to spend huge amounts of money on things we want but don't need, its not easy to keep our focus on the core values of a Christian life, such as, love, forgiveness, compassion, charity, faith, humble service, and pouring ourselves out for God and for the sake of humanity. Its not easy to forego the luxuries of extravagant living to seek only the Kingdom of God. Thats not a new thing, in the gospel reading today is an encounter that Jesus had with a fairly rich man, who asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus goes on to list some of the great commandments passed on

through Moses, the man is pleased with this because he boasts about having kept them all his life. Then Jesus really turns up the heat when he says "go sell all you have and give the money to the poor", and we read that the man went away sorrowful because he could not part with his many possessions, even if it meant eternal life in the Kingdom. What about us? We may not necessarily claim to be wealthy, but according to the standards of the vast majority of the world, we are considered to be privileged and rich. How easy would it be for us to give up all we have if we were in that man's shoes? Vast riches are hard to part with in a society that measures people by success, and success is measured by wealth. Thats why Jesus said its easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, because its hard to loosen our grip on money and material possessions even when God calls us to use it for the sake of the Kingdom. We don't need millions of dollars to give away to pass a challenge from God, all we need is the heart to give of what we already have, and to see that God is calling each of us to service and servanthood. Maybe when we see that all we have is a gift from God we can truly open ourselves up to giving some of it back to grow God's kingdom here on earth, right where we are. (Rev. Randy)
