From the Rector's desk The gospel reading (Mark 8:27-38), contains a lot of poignant words by Jesus, that challenges us to pay close attention to our relationship with God. Jesus asks the disciples a very pointed question "who do people say that I am?" They answer him with names like Elijah and John the Baptist. Then Jesus asks them an even more pointed and personal question "but who do you say that I am?" Peter, without thinking about the question, replies, "You are the Messiah". Then Jesus talks about how he will be rejected, suffer, die and rise again in three days. Peter is flabbergasted to hear such things and rebukes Jesus. Jesus gets a little angry with Peter and puts him in his place. Then he makes a very general statement that applies to every generation of Christians since, including our own, "If anyone wants to be my follower, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me...what does it profit them to gain the whole world and lose their life?" That is a very intense statement that causes us to consider the order of our priorities in life. Let's face it society today does not place much emphasis on denying ourselves, and suffering much

hardship in life. In fact, guite the opposite is the reality, the mentality that we should get as much as we can for ourselves, and forget the needs of others, seems to prevail. We don't seem to be big on a gospel that requires us to care and share. Yet, that is the very essence of discipleship and Christianity, it's not an individualistic life we are called to, but one of community, inclusiveness, and giving what we have for the good of everyone. If we start out from the premise that everything we have is a gift from God, then it becomes much easier to share that gift from a spirit of thanksgiving and blessing. What gifts do you and I have that we can use to build up our community of faith? How can we make time in our busy lives for God and for one another? Remember we are called to deny ourselves, to take up our cross, to make sacrifices on this journey we are on together. So, it's not all about us as individuals, it's also about making sure our brothers and sisters are taken care of as well. I hope that you will consider using some of your gifts right here in the parish of St. Philip's, by getting involved in the life and work of the church. Together we can accomplish much within the church and beyond in our community. Look within yourselves and search your hearts to see what God may be calling you to do and to be at this time.
