From the Rector's Desk

In the Book of Common Prayer, this Sunday was known as the Sunday next before Advent.

The collect for that Sunday is one that I like and use on a number of occasions. In the Book of Alternative Services, it comes a few weeks later. This morning, I want us to look at and pray this prayer as we sit in our pews waiting for our service to begin.

"Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (BCP – Page 259).

Tradition has it that this prayer came at a time when mothers were preparing their fruit cakes for the Christmas Season. There were no mixers, so the fruit for the cakes and the preparation was all done by hand. It is a memory, I believe, some of us have of our own mothers doing many times over around this time of the year...stirring up all the ingredients for a nice Christmas cake.

This "Sunday next before Advent" has been known as "Stir Up Sunday" and you can see where they got this name.

I believe it fits into what we now know this Sunday to be, as it is called on the calendar and in the Book of Alternative Services. We refer to this Sunday as "The Reign of Christ the King Sunday".

We need to stir up our people to recognize more in their lives that Christ reigns; that Christ is the head of the church. We may not recognize it but He has authority over us. He is in charge and His reign will succeed.

It is more and more important for us to recognize that we need to turn to Jesus Christ and claim Him as our Lord and Saviour. Make Him first in our lives, so that we are fully committed to Him in all walks of our lives. Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as your Lord and Saviour? Out of that comes - do you respect the dignity of every human being?

Here we are on the verge of a New Year in the life of our Church and there is no better way in our lives to begin than by turning over the page and beginning a new chapter. The new chapter should focus on Him who is coming and who will come as Judge and Redeemer of the world.

My prayer for us all is that we may be stirred up enough to become faithful soldiers and servants of our Saviour Jesus Christ. Let the King reign in your lives now and forever. Amen

A note from the Anglican Chaplaincy:

If you are admitted to hospital you should be asked by admitting if you would like the services of Pastoral Care. If you say "Yes", you will sign a consent form and the chaplain will see you within 24 hours. If you decline, pastoral care and later change your mind, have a nurse call the chaplain. You will be asked to sign a consent form and the chaplain will visit. Please note that due to confidentiality, the chaplains can only contact your parish priest with your permission.

MAINTENANCE FUND: We want to ask you for your continued support. It is very important for us to build on this fund so that the necessary repairs to the church can be completed in a timely manner. Please keep in mind that we were encouraged after the church was debt free to continue to give a dollar per day to this fund. <u>Prayer after Communion:</u> (In Unison): Almighty God, you have made us a royal priesthood in the kingdom of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. Make known his victory through us, we pray, that all the world may see his light. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ the Lord. Amen.
